Whether implemented to ensure compliance with the principles of the King IV Report or to illustrate good corporate governance, environmental management systems effectively improve an organisation's operational structure, economic performance and environmental sustainability.

The globally recognised ISO 14001:2015 International Standard for environmental management systems, developed by the International Organisation for Standardisation, provides organisations with a uniform, comparable and industry recognised framework for the implementation of an environmental management system.

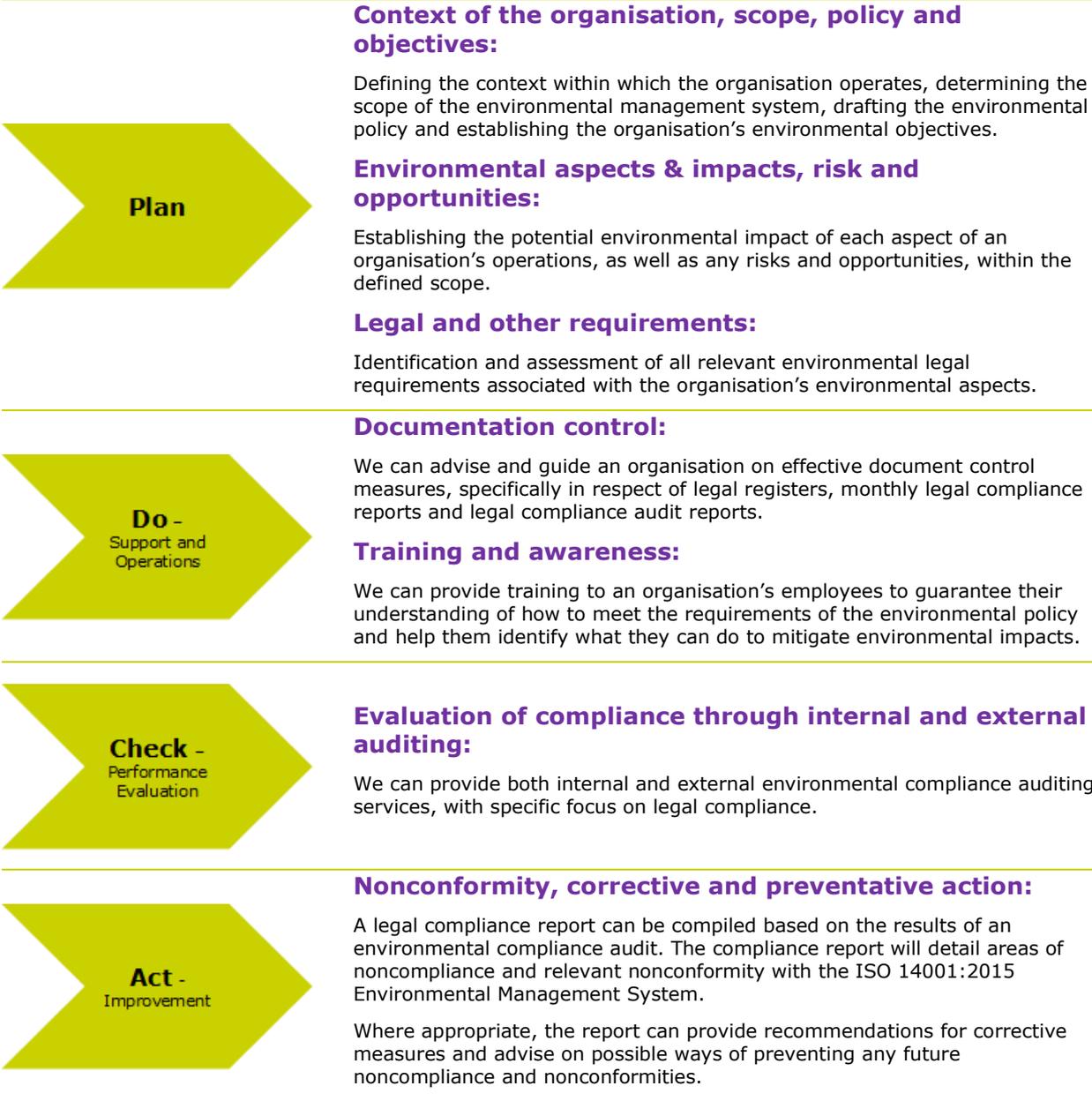
An environmental management system is a set of policies, processes and procedures developed and implemented to control the way in which an organisation interacts with the natural environment.
